<u>PROJECT DESCRIPTION</u> Environmental review for the proposed sale of an approximately 37.85 acre parcel (the "Property") within the Port of Sunnyside's (the "Port") Midvale Industrial Park in the Light Industrial (M-1) zoning district.

NOTICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW This is to notify agencies with jurisdiction and environmental expertise and the public that the City of Sunnyside, Planning Division, has been established as the lead agency, under WAC § 197-11-928 for this project. The City of Sunnyside has reviewed the proposed project for probable adverse environmental impacts and expects to issue a Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS) per WAC § 197-11-355. The proposal may include mitigation measures under applicable codes and the project review process may incorporate or require mitigation measures regardless of whether an EIS is prepared. A copy of the subsequent threshold determination may be obtained by request and may be appealed pursuant to SMC Ch. 18.04.

**Required Permits:** The following local, state, and federal permits/approvals may or will be needed for this project: Building Permit, potentially other permits suggested by DST

Required Studies: SEPA Review, No others required at this time

Name of proposed project, if applicable: The proposed sale of an approximately 37.85 acre parcel (the "Property") within the Port of Sunnyside's (the "Port") Midvale Industrial Park. The Property (identified as "Desired Location by Pacific AG") is shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto. The non-project actions for which this SEPA is submitted include (i) an amendment to the Port's Comprehensive Scheme of Harbor Improvements (the "CSHI") to

delete the Property from the CSHI, (ii) passing a resolution declaring the Property surplus to the Port's needs pursuant to RCW 53.08.090 ("Surplus Resolution"). Both of these non-project actions are determinations made by the Commission for the Port.

For clarity, after the aforementioned non-project actions the Port will consider the sale of the Property to Sunnyside RNG, LLC. The sale is exempt from SEPA review under WAC 197-11-800(5)(b).

Sunnyside RNG, LLC proposes to construct an industrial scale renewable natural gas anaerobic digestion plant which will produce some 800,000 MMBTUs of renewable natural gas annually from local dairies' manure as well as locally sourced agricultural residue. The construction will be subject to receipt of permits.

After the sale of the Property the Port will install infrastructure (road, sewer, water and power) to the Property. The installation of the infrastructure will be subject to receipt of permits.


