WA Ecology Proposes Fees for CAFO Dairies that are 20 Years Behind the Times

WA Ecology is in the process of adjusting fees for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits in our state under WAC 173-224. The deadline for submitting comments is May 12, 2023. See https://ecology.wa.gov/Regulations-Permits/Laws-rules-rulemaking/Rulemaking/WAC-173-224

Chapter 173-224 WAC implements RCW 90.48.465 that requires Ecology to establish, by rule, annual fees to recover the cost of administering the wastewater and stormwater permit programs.

NPDES permits for concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFOs) are subject to this rulemaking. The proposed fee adjustments for CAFOs are not sufficient to cover the costs of the NPDES program for CAFOs. The proposed fees for dairies are much lower than proposed fees for other CAFOs.

Ecology provides a *Focus Sheet: Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation* — *Annual water quality permit fees* at https://apps.ecology.wa.gov/publications/documents/2310012.pdf

This focus sheet says that a permitted calf feeding CAFO with 50 calves will pay \$350 for an NPDES permit. This focus sheet says that a dairy CAFO with 200 milk cows and 100 heifers will pay \$167 for an NPDES permit. Where is the equity?

Since 1999 Ecology has charged dairies \$0.50 per animal unit for NPDES permits. If Ecology had adjusted this fee, in accordance with the fiscal growth factor as provided for in RCW 90.48.465, the fee would now be \$0.87 per animal unit. But now, in 2023, Ecology proposes to increase fees for dairies to \$0.52 per

animal unit. This will not cover expenses for implementing NPDES programs for dairy CAFOs.
