Hello Helen,

In response to your concerns, Ecology believes that the makeup of the GWAC provides sufficient representation of the diverse stakeholders around the nitrate contamination problem to develop effective solutions and fulfill it's mandate; the exception being Hispanic community representation which I will address below. To be successful, we need a variety of people at the table including those that represent the industries and land uses that are implicated as sources of the nitrate contamination; they will need to take responsibility for being part of the solution. There is bound to be some overlap in interests among members. I remind you that the County GWMA application document suggested appointment of one "environmentalist" representative. Ecology appointed representatives from three environmental groups to make sure that interest was strongly represented. I suspect that many of the GWAC members would each have their own preferences about the makeup of the committee if it were up to them.

As for organizational representation, the Farm Bureau is included because they provide representation for agriculture, the major land use that must be involved in finding and implementing solutions to the nitrate problem. It seems that the Sierra Club or the River Keepers have no such direct relevance not already represented by the included environmental organizations such as yours.

Ecology agrees that representation of the people most impacted by the pollution, especially the Hispanic community, needs to be strengthened. I am in the process of finding out if Robert Morales will be able to serve actively on the Committee; if not a replacement will need to be found. I will bring up to the group the idea that perhaps we should appoint a second representative for this community (as well as their alternates). I have also been involved in discussions with EPA and Ecology Environmental Justice advocates about seeing that EJ is considered by the Committee as it conducts its business. Tom Eaton will make a proposal to the group about that.
